No spectator, participant, owner, handler, breeder or kennel shall make commercial use of any video recordings of any person or animal participating in this event without prior written approval from the Club. This event may not be broadcast to social media (e.g. Facebook Live, etc) without prior written approval from the Club.

Veteran Dog/Bitch Classes – In accordance with AKC's Rules Applying to Dog Shows, Chapter 11, Section 8: Castrated dogs and spayed bitches may be entered in the Veteran Classes.

Working Dog/Bitch Classes – Open to any dog or bitch holding a Working Dog Certificate issued by AMCA. Castrated dogs and spayed bitches may be entered in the Working Classes.

Awards of Merit (Both Specialties)

Awards of Merit may be awarded to those dogs or bitches NOT winning Best of Breed, Best of Opposite to Best of Breed, Select Dog or Select Bitch, but of such outstanding quality as to deserve honorable mention. Recipients are to be selected at the Judge's discretion and awards given immediately following the awarding of Best of Breed, Best of Winners, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. The total number of such awards shall be limited to not more than 12.5% of the total entry present in the Best of Breed ring, or to 10 awards, whichever is less.

Best Puppy, Best Bred-by-Exhibitor, Best Veteran and Best Working (National Specialty Only)

First place in each 6-9 and 9-12 class and Puppy Bred-by-Exhibitor will compete for Best Puppy. If a puppy is Best of Breed or Best of Winners, that puppy will automatically win Best Puppy. Best Bred-by, Best Veteran and Best Working will be chosen in the same manner, from the first-place exhibits in each Bred-by-Exhibitor (Adult & Puppy), Veterans and Working Classes.

Points for Reserve Available: At each Regional and National Specialty, the dog designated Reserve Winners Dog and the bitch designated Reserve Winners Bitch will be awarded a three-point major, provided that the number of dogs competing in the regular classes of the Reserve Winner's Sex totals at least twice the number required for a five point major, in the region in which the events are held.

Non-Regular Classes

(Multiple Dog Entries, National Specialty Only)

Stud Dogs Brood Bitches Brace

As the judge's decision in the Non-Regular Classes involving Multiple Dog entries is based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in these classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won these classes.

Stud Dog/Brood Bitch Class – Dogs/Bitches (may be altered) and are shown with two of their off-spring. Owner of Stud Dog/Brood Bitch need not necessarily be owner of offspring. Class is judged on the merits of the offspring, but the parent will be examined for DQs/excuses. Offspring must be entered in a regular conformation class.

Entry is made for the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch - offspring are not entered on the entry form.

Brace Class – For two Alaskan Malamutes with at least one owner in common. *Both dogs must be entered in another class to qualify for the additional class entry fee.* The two dogs comprising the Brace shall be considered a unit and they must be named at time of entry. If a dog, which is to be part of a brace, is not entered in a regular class, or Best of Breed Competition, the dog must be entered for “Brace Class Only.” In making entries for Brace Class Only, full particulars must be given for each dog on individual regular entry forms. An entry form for a dog entered in another class and entered as a part of a brace, **MUST** be marked accordingly in the space provided for ADDITIONAL CLASSES - “Brace Class.” If more than one Brace is entered by the identical owner, the dogs comprising EACH brace must be designated “Brace No. 1”, “Brace No. 2”, etc. ***Please designate on the entry form in the Custom Information • Brace No. 1 AKC # and AKC Registered Name & Brace No. 2 AKC # and AKC Registered Name***

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

NOVICE JUNIOR CLASS-For Boys and Girls at least 9 and under 12 years of age on the day of the show who at the time entries close, have not won three (3) first place awards★, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATECLASS-For Boys and Girls at least 12 and under 15 years of age on the day of the show who at the time entries close, have not won three (3) first place awards★, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

NOVICE SENIOR CLASS- For Boys and Girls at least 15 and under 18 years of age on the day of the show who at the time entries close, have not won three (3) first place awards★, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

OPEN JUNIOR CLASS- For Boys and Girls at least 9 and under 12 years of age on the day of the show who at the time entries close, have won three (3) first place awards★ in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show, with competition present in the Novice Class.

OPEN INTERMEDIATECLASS-For Boys and Girls at least 12 and under 15 years of age on the day of the show who at the time entries close, have won three (3) first place awards★ in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show, with competition present in the Novice Class.

OPEN SENIOR CLASS- For Boys and Girls at least 15 and under 18 years of age on the day of the show who at the time entries close, have won three (3) first place awards★ in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show, with competition present in the Novice Class.

MASTER CLASS- For Boys and Girls at least 9 and under 18 years of age on the day of the show and who have won ten (10) Best Junior Handler awards with competition. The calendar for this class will be consistent with the eligibility dates for the AKC National Championship. All juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and must change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed, all participants return to the Open Class to compete for the following year. NOTICE: Junior Handlers must include their AKC JUNIOR HANDLER NUMBER on each entry.

Current assistants that are eligible to compete in Junior Showmanship (meet age & amateur status requirements) may participate in NOHS.

- Sportspeople appreciate, encourage and support all who associate with and participate in the sports by fostering an environment where respect, equity, inclusion, and courtesy are foundational.

- Sportspeople treat fellow exhibitors, judges, officials, volunteers, spectators, and AKC staff with dignity and respect, regardless of experience, background, or differences in opinion.
- Sportspeople are committed to fair play, honesty, courtesy, and competition, approaching both winning and losing with grace.
- Sportspeople understand that strong competition and civility can—and should—coexist. They appreciate the quality of their competitors, and the effort put forth by others.
- Sportspeople uphold their responsibilities to the sport of purebred dogs and refuse to let personal gain or self-interest influence their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsperson judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsperson judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsperson exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsperson exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- Sportspeople are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportspeople decline to exploit any positions of authority or recognition for personal advantage.
- Sportspeople appreciate those that have gone before them and realize they are responsible for maintaining and enhancing the sport for future generations.
